Ken Phillips reports from the second weekend.

aving finished in an expected fifth place after the first weekend we approached Kettering more with hope than dreams of success.

In our first match we raced to a 0-3 deficit against a strong Peniel team and the writing appeared to be on the wall for another disappointing weekend. Jesper Hougaard then played superbly to beat top 20 junior Ben Linnecar and Martin Rule followed with a relatively easy success over their number three. David Ralls then beat England number 30 David Coleman to round off a good team performance with a 3-3 draw.

The next match saw us face the champions elect from Launceston and although Jesper beat another top 20 junior in Robert Abbots and Martin won one, Nick found the opposition too strong and we lost 2-4.

The final game of the day against the bottom team was perhaps the disappointment of the weekend, Jesper played well to record two victories but David with one and Nick with none failed to impress against mediocre opposition and we had to settle for a 3-3 draw.

Sunday's first game against a strong Irish Boys team saw us lose 1-5 with only Martin winning a game. This result is not as bad as it appears with the lads playing well to no avail.

The final match of the weekend provided a good 5-1 victory against Light Freight Generation II with Martin and David winning two each and Jesper one.

We ended in fifth place as expected, but given the jump from Division Three to Division One and the fact that three of our players are still cadets, the overall performance was good. Our player of the weekend must be Jesper who played at number one and did himself a lot of good with wins against top 20 juniors.

### Coaching at Cippenham - What A Success!

A fter a quiet beginning, the numbers attending the coaching sessions have built up well with the Tuesday and Thursday sessions now attracting 20 or so participants. The Monday evening advanced sessions for invited juniors began with some 30 plus members and this will increase to 40 after Easter as more younger players show the commitment and potential required.

Only two members of the elite group do not have an England ranking and half a dozen of the younger advanced group appear on the list. At cadet (under-14) level we have three players in the England top 20 and at under-12 we have three in the top ten boys and two in the top ten girls.

The beginners groups are starting to produce some decent youngsters and more recently have attracted a fair number of Westgate pupils which should cement our partnership with the school.

We have yet to provide a coaching facility specifically for adults but one or two older Club members do attend the beginners group in an effort to improve their game.

Feeders are still required for the advanced squads and anyone interested should contact Ken Phillips. We are gradually building up our coaching team with one or two looking to advance their qualification.



### Mike is so close at Veterans' Open

Mike Rhodes came so close to making it a home win when Cippenham held its Veterans' Open Championships on 22nd February. In the end Mike had to content himself with the runners-up trophy after losing a three game thriller to Derek Wood. Seeded sixth for the tournament, Mike won the first game of the final 21-19 and had seemingly ended the Essex player's aspirations when he led 14-7 in the second game. Incredibly, Wood found new inspiration and reeled off a succession of points to win the game 21-16. Despite leading at the start of the third game, Mike could not quite find the finishing line and Wood won an exciting third game 21-18.

In his semi-final Mike had overcome his unseeded Bucks team mate Mike Atkinson of Chiltern while Wood, who was seeded seventh, comprehensively ended the threat of second seeded Paul Beck of Kent.

It was a day when the seeds did not have things all their own way. Number one seed Terry Guymer (Essex) failed to appear and fifth seed Dennis Holland (Gloucestershire) pulled out in the week before with a back injury. Fourth seed Derek Holman (Surrey), many people's favourite for the title, did not even qualify from his group, beaten by Glenn Johnson (Essex). Third seeded Ramesh Bhalla (Hampshire) came only second in his group and was then eliminated in the first knock-out round by Terry Parkins (Wiltshire).

Apart from Mike Rhodes, two other Cippenham members qualified from their groups but Peter Hillier and Paul Savage were both eliminated in the first round. In the consolation event, tournament organiser Graham Trimming played well throughout the afternoon dispatching two Oxfordshire county players and then a player from the Netherlands before losing to Fred Dove (Suffolk) in the final. Also in the consolation Chris Dickens had a good run through to the semi-final.

To complete an Essex clean sweep, Marilyn Bawden won the Womens' Singles despite finishing only second in her group after losing to Oxfordshire's Janet Brown. Bawden was seeded one and expected to win, but her loss in the group meant that she met second seed Pauline Steel (Sussex) in the semi-final. After losing the first game, Bawden found her form and reached the final when she beat surprise finalist Sharon Mitchell (Berkshire). Mitchell had beaten Janet Brown in the semifinal 22-20, 21-19.
