

It's Martin's Title at the Open

Martin Adams became the first Cippenham member to win the Men's Singles title at the Cippenham 2 Star Open Championships on 7th January at the sixth running of the event.

Martin, who plays for Cippenham in the British League and spearheads the Cippenham Aces team in the new Cippenham Super League, was largely untroubled throughout the day. After winning his group the top seed accounted for Roland Zaunmayr and then demolished Berkshire county player Hari Gehlot 21-4, 21-10 in the quarter-final. The semi-final saw Martin beat another Cippenham Super League player, Karl Bushell, the Oxfordshire number one, 21-19, 21-16 before beating Surrey's Steve Davis 21-8, 25-23 in the final. The second game of the final brought out the best in both Martin and Davis who fought out a series of rallies with the ball spinning furiously and travelling at break-neck speed.

Davis' semi-final victim had been Neil Wright of Hertfordshire, the number six seed who had scored an impressive victory over second seed Ramesh Bhalla in the semi. Another Cippenham member, Maurice Isaacs, turned back the years by beating Geoff Grange and Tom Adams before falling to Davis in the quarters. Five other Cippenham members survived the group stage: Robert Hansell, Phil Clarkson, Terry Boxall, Tim Heaps and Andy Misseldine but only the latter went one round further.

The Women's Singles did not feature many local players and was won by top seed Rosemary Rainton (Sussex) who defeated Amanda Alabaster (Kent) in the final. The semi-finalists were Sharon Mitchell of Reading and Ashford's Diane Melville.

Another Award for Kai

Cippenham's Kai Milvek was given the award for Veteran Player of the Year in Estonia in recognition of her bronze nedal in the Women's Doubles event at the World Veterans' Championships in Vancouver and her quarter-final placing in the Women's Singles at the same tournament.

Slough out of Alec Brook

Slough's veteran men's team of Mike Rhodes, Paul Baker and Graham Trimming crashed out of the Alec Brook Trophy at Stage 1 when losing to Guildford 4-5 and Bromley 2-5. Mike and Paul each won three times for Slough.

Nothing to Cheer at WIBL

Both Cippenham teams returned from the final session of the Women's British League in Cheshire unsuccessful. The first team finished bottom of the Premier Division, and only secured one draw and a walkover in the last five matches. It was known some days before the event that league leaders Ulster Ladies would not be present so, having only four matches to play, the first team decided to travel with only three players. This spared Kai Milvek, their most successful player in the first weekend, the flight over from her home in Estonia.

Surprisingly, the draw came in the final match of the weekend and was gained at the expense of the second-placed team Leeds Ladies. Cippenham went 3-0 down in this match before Joanna Parker, Rebecca Fisher and Gemma Chapman all won their final matches.

The weekend began with a disappointing 5-1 reverse against Hull Sandhill for whom Cippenham member Samantha Marling plays. Nevertheless, three sets were lost at -17 in the third or closer in this match including Gemma Chapman's deuce in the third defeat by Joanna Roberts. Further defeats were suffered at the hands of Suvi Sportswear, the champions, and Horsham.

The second team finished fifth in Division 2 but was severely weakened during the weekend by the absence of team captain Clare Plumridge (business commitments) and Sue Hayes (family illness). Jan Chapman deputised to play alongside Ruth Bentley and Jane Dickens. Cippenham's only point came in the 3-3 draw with Norton Ladies when Ruth Bentley starred with a brace and Jane secured the third.

Ruth played well all weekend and picked up two more in the 2-4 defeat by Midland Ladies as well as two others in the other matches. Jan also played well to win a set, in the final match against Norwich, and was unlucky to fail at deuce in the third in the 2-4 defeat by Sutton at Hone.

Though Cippenham may not have had the best results, it has to be borne in mind that both teams were promoted out of turn to a division higher than anticipated, and both lacked their star players for the second half.

Vets Miss Clive but Paul Plays a Blinder

Paul Baker had his best ever series of re sults for Cippenham in the Veteran's British League Division 2 during the weekend of January 20/21 but despite this his team could only manage three points out of a possible ten.

Cippenham went into the first half of matches under-strength, lacking the services of top player Clive Payne whose results had been instrumental in gaining promotion from Division 3 last season. Clive was unavailable through work commitments but Cippenham swiftly signed up Great Britain paraplegic international player Tim Heaps to replace him.

With Tim at number two in the team, Mike Rhodes was elevated to the number one position with Paul staying at number three.

The weekend got off to a flying start on Saturday morning as Cippenham cruised to a 5-1 win over Seasiders (Blackpool). After Tim had lost the first match to the Seasiders number one, Cippenham staged a comeback with Mike and Paul winning closely fought matches before the last three were won in easier fashion.

However, it proved to be a false dawn as tabletoppers Thompson Insurance, from the northeast of England, dented Cippenham's aspirations with a 5-1 beating. Only Paul was successful in this match, getting the better of Colin Hunt at deuce in the third, and was desperately unlucky not to add a second scalp after leading John Williamson by a game and 19-14.

Cippenham suffered another 5-1 defeat on Saturday evening, this time to Graham Spicer Club (New Malden), the team that finished a full five points behind them in Division 3 in the previous season. Again, Cippenham's only success came from Paul with a fantastic 24-22 in the third win over the highly ranked Derek Holman.

On Sunday morning Cippenham played out a 3-3 draw with bottom team Police Athletic Association. Mike got the team off to a great start by demolishing the defence of David Solman, then Paul again came to the fore with wins over Alec Johns and Solman. At 3-2 to Cippenham, Tim could not quite get the further score that was needed when he fell 21-18 in the third to Johns.

In the final match of the weekend Paul capped his superb display with two more wins, over Gary Morgan and Paul Beck but Cippenham still lost 4-2 to Ellenborough (Enfield) and finished in fifth position. Paul's display over the weekend, with eight wins from ten matches, was awesome in a losing team while being the lowest ranked player in the division at the start of play.
