MARK RETAINS HIS TITLE AT CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

Mark Jackson retained his Open Singles title at the Club Championships on June 16th. Mark, who lives in Warwick but still turns out for Cippenham in the Slough League, is turning into a tournament specialist, as he also won the Slough Closed Championships in April. In the final Mark beat cadet David Hayes while in the semi-finals Mark beat Nick Hansell and David beat Gemma Chapman.

In a strong quarter-final line-up Mark beat his British League team-mate Robert Lemon, Nick Hansell beat Graham Trimming, David had a win over Paul Baker while Gemma triumphed over second seed Robert Hansell.

Mark added a second title when he and Robert Hansell beat the junior pairing of Shaun Robertson and Chris Sabourin in the Open Doubles. The latter pair had earlier eliminated top seeds Gemma and Robert Lemon in the semi-final.

Making up for his loss in the final of the Open Singles, David Hayes still managed to take two singles titles. In the Boys' Singles he beat Robert Lemon while the Cadet Singles provided an easier opponent in Sylvana Bielec. Paul Baker took the Veterans' Singles title, Robert Hansell the Tweenie Singles, beating Mark Jackson in the final, Gemma Chapman the Girls' Singles and Melanie Farquhar the U12 Singles.

The Junior Doubles provided a reversal of the Open Doubles semi when Robert Lemon and Gemma Chapman beat Shaun and Chris in the final, this time three-straight.

Top Seeds Prevail at Veterans' Open

Top seeds Dave Harvey (Gloucestershire) and Sheila King (Sussex) were the winners of the Cippenham Veterans' Summer 2-Star Open Championships on 15th June. Neither was troubled too much although King did drop a game to runner-up Jackie Wood, a former Cippenham member.

Harvey's opponent in the men's final was third seed Chris Pickard (Middlesex) after the latter had disposed of second seed Derek Holman (Surrey) in the semi-final. Harvey's victim in the semi was fourth seed Henry Buist (Kent). Although all the top four seeds took up their positions in the semis it was not so clear-cut in the quarters. Fifth seed Steve Davis (Surrey) lost in the last sixteen, at deuce in the fifth, to Hampshire's Charlie Childs, while eighth seed Tom Carr (Herts) lost his position in the preliminary round group to Mike Wilkins of Bucks. Carr went through his group in second place but then lost to Dave Crowley (Middx) in the first round before Crowley became a victim of Pickard one round later. Wilkins was upended in the first round by surprise package Geoff Ware (Hants) who had also had an impressive win over Chris Gibbons (Northants) in the groups. Tony Brown (Berks) followed up his first round win over John Barclay (Bucks) by beating Ware to set up a quarter-final meeting which he lost to Harvey.

The last surviving Cippenham members were Mike Rhodes, who survived until the quarters where he lost to Buist, and Ken Philipson who went out at the same stage to Holman. The other Cippenham player to make it through the groups was tournament organiser Graham Trimming. He then lost narrowly in the fifth game to previous champion Davis.

The women's event was played in two groups of four players with the top two progressing into a final group of four and the others playing off in a consolation group. Apart from King and Wood, the other players to make it into the competition proper were Sue Adamson (Surrey) and Lorna Slifkin (Middx).

May



Further national titles are won at the National Team Finals. Cippenham, with a team of Sue Hayes, Gemma Chapman, and Jane Dickens win the Gainsford Cup while Slough, represented by Sylvana Bielec, Catherine Hayes and Caroline Linz win the Hammersley Cup. Slough are also represented in the finals of the Carter Cup and Leach Cup.

Joanna Parker surpasses expectations to win the National Junior Girls' championship, after finishing third in the National Junior Masters.

June

Gavin Evans does the double of U11B5 and U10B5 at the National U10/11/12 Championships. Katie Rule reaches the final of U10G5.

Tournaments take a new dimension at Cippenham as 180 players and 326 entries play 850 matches over two days at the Cippenham Young Players' Summer Festival. Several home players win events in the best yet at England's most developed club.
