Host club players lead the way in the Buckinghamshire Junior Closed Championships

# Another Clean Sweep For Cippenham

Gemma Chapman (12) and 13 years-old Warren Brooks won seven titles between them as Cippenham players, for the third year running, won every title at the Buckinghamshire Junior Closed Championships on 8th November at Cippenham Table Tennis Centre.

Gemma, fresh from an England training camp in France over the half term break, won all four events open to her. In the final of the U17 Girls' Singles she beat one Cippenham team mate in Jane Dickens, and had earlier accounted for another, Emma Human, in the U14 Girls' Singles. In the U17 Girls' Doubles she teamed up with Emma to defeat Jane and Rebecca Eldridge, and then won her fourth title in the U17 Mixed Doubles in tandem with Joe Ferguson when they beat Robert Hansell and Rebecca.

Warren Brooks, the reigning England Under-12 singles champion, won the U17 Boys' Singles by beating Thomas Mitchell in the semi-final and Daniel Jacobs in the final. Daniel had beaten Robert Hansell in his semi-final in an event dominated by Cippenham youngsters. Thomas had done very well to reach the semi-final and his run included a superb quarter-final victory over Ben Beveridge. Warren also beat Thomas in the final of the U14 Boys' Singles in which the beaten semi-finalists were Bradley Evans and Joe Ferguson. The third title that Warren captured was the U17 Boys' Doubles when he partnered his brother Duane to a final win over Robert Hansell and Daniel Jacobs.

The Under-12 events also proved successful for Cippenham players, underlying the great potential in the club at this

age level. The U12 Boys' Singles was won by Thomas Mitchell, ranked six in England, who, after defeating Paul Zeun in the semi-final, put paid to the challenge of 9 years-old Bradley Evans in the final. Bradley's semi-final win over Cippenham U10 Open champion, David Hayes, was one of two such successes over his older opponent on the day. Both are in the England U12 training squad. Cippenham's clean sweep of all events was completed by Emily Tucker's win in the U12 Girls' Singles.

Cippenham players were not so successful in the consolation events, mainly because, as Club Head Coach Ken Phillips said "our players were not in the consolations!" However, Helen Smith and Emily Tucker managed to win two of the singles events for the Club, and David Hayes and Jenny Hansell both reach a final.

All in all, this was another successful event well staged by Ken Phillips at Cippenham.

## Mike Stars for Veterans ...

The Cippenham men's team had mixed fortunes in the Veterans' British Table Tennis League during the weekend 14/15th November. In the first half fixtures, played at Rugby, Cippenham finished with five points in fourth place in Division Four, having won one and drawn three of their five matches.

The star for Cippenham was Mike Rhodes who won eight of his ten matches playing from the number one position. Paul Baker beat all the opposing number three players but lost to all the number ones for a 50% record, while Graham Trimming could manage only two wins.

The weekend began badly with Cippenham's only reverse against local rivals Ashford. One win each from Mike and Paul resulted in a 4-2 defeat although all three Cippenham players were involved in close tussles which were all lost very closely in the third game.
