A maximum twelve points on Saturday; runners-up for third team; safety for first team

Super Saturday brings reward

on Sunday

The Cippenham table tennis teams were in great form during the final session of fixtures in the British League. Early season woes were forgotten as a Super Saturday brought rewards on Sunday. There was great team effort and inspired personal performances as Cippenham's three teams plundered a maximum twelve points from their matches on the first day of the final weekend. Another six points on Sunday confirmed the safety of all the teams in their respective divisions and a runners-up spot for the third team.

For the third team, playing at Southall Sports Centre, it was true rags to riches story. At Christmas, after eight of the fourteen matches had been played, Cippenham were bottom of Division 3 South, albeit level on points in a very tight division. Two victories on the single day's play in January saw them leapfrog three teams and take fifth place. Incredibly, this run was extended to six wins on the trot with four great victories at the weekend. Even more creditable, these wins were earned without the services of top player Eddie Mitchell who was required by Buckinghamshire to play in the clashing County Championships Cadet Premier Division.

Steve Buck was drafted into the side on Saturday and his four wins from the number one position set up a 7-1 win over hosts DHS Greenhouse Progress IV and 6-2 over Horsham who were a



player short. Chris Hansell also maintained his good form with an unbeaten display while Tony Stead won his two matches against Progress and Paul Baker added the other. With Phil Prady replacing Steve for the Sunday matches it seemed that Cippenham might struggle but Phil, who had not won in four earlier matches, rose to the occasion and won all his three games. Tony also remained unbeaten during the day and Chris tasted defeat only once as Cippenham secured 6-2 victories over SEH-Britannia Ipswich and Crusaders.

The Cippenham first team went into the final weekend bottom of Division 1 South, having already lost to the team they needed to overtake to avoid relegation. It needed a heroic performance and that is what it got, not least from Rob Lemon. Rob had struggled with his form all season and went into the weekend with only three wins from twenty starts. By the time Sunday evening arrived he had added to that an incredible seven wins from eight. But it

was a team performance of the highest order with Lee Dredge winning five times, Mark Butler four and the captain Martin Adams three plus a walkover.

Three of the four matches were won as Cippenham trebled their points tally for the season to finish five points clear of relegated York Gardens but only in seventh placed despite their nine points. VRS Generation, who finished fourth, were first to suffer at Cippenham's hands. They lost 5-3. Next it was BATTS Team Peniel II on the receiving end 6-2, a result that temporarily lifted Cippenham into sixth place ahead of their Harlow-based opponents. However, BATTS won twice on Sunday while Cippenham won only once and the places were reversed once again. A disappointing 3-5 loss to third placed Woolwell was the only blemish on the weekend before fifthplaced DHS Greenhouse Progress II were despatched 6-2.

The second team also joined in the fun on Saturday with a fantastic 6-2 win

cippenham Table Tennis Club is pleased and excited to announce the creation of a part-time job coaching table tennis in schools in its catchment area. In conjunction with the English Table Tennis Association and the Slough and Wexham School Sport Partnership, the opportunity is to coach an average of ten hours per week (400 hours p.a.) in schools in the Slough area and at Cippenham Table Tennis Club and is for a fixed term of 18 months.

The successful candidate will be qualified to at least Level 2 (ETTA) and be paid £15 per hour. He/she will be employed by the English Table Tennis Association and report to Lisa Bosley, the South Region Development Officer, and a management support group that will include a representative of Cippenham Table Tennis Club and the Slough and Wexham School Sport Partnership.

The focus of the job will be to introduce school pupils to the sport and also to bring the more aspiring into main line table tennis by a special weekly session at the Club.

The closing date for applications is 9 March and a form will be posted on the ETTA website. Further details are available on the Club's webs site.

over then second-placed OLOP IM-PACT and the same scoreline against seventh-placed Carrara Polska. The result over Reading rivals OLOP was especially impressive and included physically tiring and ultimately profitable duels for David Hayes and Martin Gray over ace defender David Barr. Barr's defensive returns are like heavilv loaded missiles and he is just as entertaining to watch now as he was when he was in the England squad. Temporarily, the Cippenham second team rose to fourth place in Division 1 South and Midlands having completed four straight wins after being bottom of the table at Christmas. However, the Sunday replacements for Danny and Steve, Mark Jackson and Steve Buck, were not so successful and Cippenham slipped to defeats in their final two matches, 0-8 against a flying Elgre Nottingham side who leapfrogged OLOP into second place as a consequence and 2-6 against Kingfisher, a result that saw Cippenham slip down to fifth place behind their Reading ri-

Roger and Paul both weighed in with two wins while Charlie got the other. Roger again got a brace in the 4-2 win over Ashford. Perhaps it was a case of the better performances coming against the stiffer opposition as champions Bribar Fusion beat Cippenham only 4-2 only after Mike had lost a tight game against Simon Phillipsz 3-2. Cippenham raced into a 3-0 lead against fourth-placed Seasiders but the Blackpool-based team hit back with the last three.

Eddie Stars in JBL as Boys finish fourth ...

ddie Mitchell won nine of his ten matches as the Cippenham boys' team enjoyed a prosperous time at Wolverhampton in the second and final weekend of the Junior British League. Six wins also from Ruihao Zhang and three from Andrew Linz helped Cippenham to seven points out of a possible ten and elevated the team into fourth position in Division 2A, losing out on third place only on sets difference. It was a hugely improved performance after an indifferent first weekend in October.

Eddie's only loss came in the match against Dumfries, the Scottish winners of the division. Eddie and Andrew both beat Perry Nash in this match but Cippenham suffered their only defeat of the weekend 2-4. Runners-up DHS Greenhouse Progress 3 were held to a 3-3 draw and there were fine wins by 4-2 over third-placed Burton Uxbridge 2 and fifth-placed Ael-y-Bryn, while bottom team Sheffield were trounced 5-1.

The inexperienced girls' team were less successful. The highlights were three wins for Stephanie Mitchell, sister of Eddie, but neither Emma Elliston nor Angela Oetiker were able to add to her success. These came in the three 1-5 defeats to Morpeth School A and B and York Road. A 2-4 result was gained against Waterside B through them being a player short and a 6-0 walkover was recorded against the absent Spicer/York Gardens.

... and at Maidenhead

Eddie Mitchell, after eliminating former champion Mark Banks, very nearly caused a major shock in the Men's Singles final of the Maidenhead Closed. Eddie led Hari Gehlot 2-1 in games before finally losing in the fifth. It was the second meeting between the two players with Gehlot having won the final of the Premier Division Singles 3-0.

There were titles for other Cippenham members. Jan and Gemma Chapman won the Ladies' Doubles, a springboard to a hat-trick of titles for Gemma who also won the Ladies' Singles and the Tweenies' Singles. Gemma was also runner-up in the Mixed Doubles as was Elroy Hull in the Division One Singles.
