David So Close at Banded Open

The unseeded Essex junior Umair Mauthoor was the star of the Cippenham Banded 2-Star Open on 7th December but he had to come back from a game down in the final of the Men's Band 1 Singles to beat Cippenham's own 15-year old star David Hayes. Mauthoor had overcome second seed Vytas Rybakas, a Lithuanian also living in Essex, to win his group, and then beat top seed Hari Gehlot in the quarter-finals. Mauthoor eased past Norman Swift in the semi-final to set up a clash between two of the country's brightest young players.

David did it the hard way in his group needing five games in each of his matches against David Kellard and Reading's top seeded Hari Gehlot. After that it got easier as David beat Rybakas threestraight in the quarters and then Daniel Cannon by three very easy games in the semis. Tournament organizer Paul Baker also had a good day, beating Steve Davis, Norman Swift and John McCance in his group before succumbing to Cannon in the quarters.

Band 2 was also won by an unseeded player in the form of Charles Acquah. Acquah deposed second seed and Slough League player John Barclay in his group and then proceeded to eliminate Roland McLellan and Devesh Shete before coming out on top in a five game struggle with top seed Mark Purcell (Bucks) in the final. Purcell, after wining his group, had eliminated Barclay and Brighton University student Rory Scott.

Bracknell's Clive Banham came closest to providing local success in the Band 3 event but he was beaten by Jeff Rigby in the final.

An entry of 63 was received for the second running of this Banded Open and the whole event ran smoothly and finished on time thanks to the efforts of the tournament organizer Paul Baker and first time Referee Peter Hillier. Slough Teams Progress

On the same Sunday as the British League matches, Cippenham youngsters represented Slough in two national competitions and came through both unscathed.

The Carter Cup Stage 1 was staged at Cippenham with Slough beating North Middlesex 5-2 and Reading 5-0. In the first match David Hayes won all his three matches while James Milton and Oliver Shaw each won one but both lost to Marc Armstrong who also trains at Cippenham. Ashley Shaw replaced David for the match against Reading that was won in a canter by the local team.

The girls' team travelled to Hastings and beat the host side 5-2 despite being 2-0 down at one stage. Star of the show was Sylvana Bielec who won all three of her matches while Caroline Linz and Jenny Hansell each won one out of two.

A couple of weeks later the veteran men's team was in action at Ashford in the Alec Brook Trophy. Dave Bull failed to appear so Mike Rhodes (3) and Paul Baker (2) were left to beat Maidenhead 5-2 on their own. As SOS then secured the services of Graham Trimming to supplement the team for the final two matches. After a 5-3 defeat against Reading (Mike 2, Paul 1) Slough needed to beat Staines (who had beaten Reading 5-4) by a least 5-3 in order to progress in the competition. With a fantastic performance from Paul (3) and another good one from Mike (2) that is exactly what was achieved after a thrilling nail-biting finale.

Champions Vagabonds Lead the Way in Record Bid

Three Cippenham teams are on course to make history in the Slough League. If Rogues, Buccaneers and Vagabonds maintain their current positions at the top of Divisions 1, 2 and 3 respectively it will be the first time that teams from the same club have won the top three divisions of the League outright since the competition commenced in 1931.

It will take a monumental gaff for Rogues to relinquish the stranglehold that Cippenham have had on the League in recent years and they look set to register the Club's eleventh consecutive win. In fact, Rogues have only dropped two points so far and that was against bottom team South Bucks UNISON Bees when they turned up a man short. Vagabonds, demoted from Division 2 last season, have done even better and have dropped only one point. They lead the second-placed team by an incredible forty points and have already secured the championship of Division 3.

The team upon whom the record depends is surely Buccaneers who lead Division 2 by only eight points and one of the chasing teams has a game in hand. They will also have to fulfil their remaining fixtures without the presence of Jeremy Bateman who has unfortunately hurt his ankle and is in plaster (get fit soon, Jerry!)

Several players are still unbeaten in the League with David Hayes and James Milton having yet to taste defeat in five games each in Division 1 while newcomer

Boys Lead the Way

Cippenham Boys' B team lead the way in Division 1 of the National Junior League after the second stage was held at Cippenham on 13 December. A new format is bring tried this season for the boys' event with the 24 teams being split into six divisions. Between each of the four sessions promotion and relegation operates for the top and bottom team of each division. The top three divisions are being played at Cippenham and the lower three divisions at Chesham High School.

The top boys' team improved on their first session in which they finished only third behind ALNS and Waterside. Good performances from the Shaw brothers, Oliver and Ashley and Prabdeep Panesar elevated the team two positions in the second stage in which the teams started at zero again. The C team finished top of Division 2 in the first stage but could make no impression at the higher level and will swap once again with Milton Keynes A. The E team are in free fall having finished bottom of Divisions 3 and 4 in successive stages. The D team are following the downward trend and will also have to play at Chesham next time around. A young girls' team are sixth in their division of 7 teams despite having won more than half of their matches.

CIPPENHAM NEWS Indifferent Results in British League

N either Cippenham team enjoyed par ticularly good results during the second weekend of matches in the British League in December. The first team travelled to Oakhampton in Devon and returned with just two points out of eight in Division 1 South while the second team did only slightly better at Ashford (Middlesex) in Division 2 South.

Handicapped by a back injury to skipper Clive Payne, the first team were never at full strength and managed only one win from their four matches. Tunbridge Wells club Byng Hall were Cippenham's first opponents and, despite two good wins for Mark Butler over Mark Brown and Phil Cox, and another for Terry Haley over Will Power which made the score 3-3, the last two sets eluded Terry and Lee Dredge and Cippenham finished 3-5 losers. Mark was the only player in form on the Saturday but his solitary win over Mike Short was all Cippenham could muster as promotion hopefuls DML Plymouth ran out easy 7-1 winners.

Sunday started better for Cippenham with a 6-2 win over bottom club PSP from Wiltshire. The normally dependable Martin Adams, who had a torrid weekend, made his only contribution in this match with a win over Tim O'Mahoney. Mark won twice as did Terry while Lee finished the match off with an 11-9 in the fifth win over Michelle Cohen. On the Sunday afternoon Cippenham went 5-1 down to Ellenborough before Terry and Lee made the scoreline a more respectable 5-3. Terry had earlier also beaten Simon Phillipsz to complete his brace.



The second team started off with a devastating 8-0 loss to host club Ashford but the same quartet of Mark Jackson, Robert Hansell, David Hayes and Gemma Chapman bounced back on Saturday afternoon to produce a 4-4 draw with Oxford Fireplace Centre. Slough League Men's Singles champion David led with two wins supplemented by one each from Mark and Bucks Closed champion Robert.

Sunday brought more dismay with a 2-6 loss to runaway division leaders London Progress III. Paul Baker replaced David, who was representing Slough in the Carter Cup, for this match but was unable to match his younger team mate's performance from a day earlier. Mark and Robert won one each for Cippenham. The final match of the weekend did bring smiles, however, as Guildford were dispatched 5-3. David, back in the team by now replacing Gemma, won his two matches and secured the man of the match award. Robert also won his two and the victory was completed with a win by Mark.
