Paul Is Back!

ast your mind back just over a year to the sickening news that Paul Baker, one of the Club's stalwarts over the past decade, had suffered a terrible injury in a freak boating accident whilst on holiday in New Zealand. Paul's leg was severely broken in many places and it was wondered whether he would ever play again.

Those who know Paul would never have doubted his desire to get back and the tenacity with which he would approach regaining his fitness.

A year on and after a few casual knocks, Paul decided to have a go at the Grand Prix, the ideal event in which to regain some match fitness in less formal competition. The deft footwork that used to propel Paul around the court is yet missing, in fact his movement is somewhat laboured, but the sureness of touch, the accuracy of shot and the unerring arm action are all there, all ingredients that made Paul such a good player in his prime.

Paul won two of the three Grand Prix events he started and the 270 points he amassed proved enough to gain the title of Grand Prix 6. Paul Elliott and Steve Crow (a blast from the past) won one each of their three and finished in second and third places while Steve Buck's two wins were not backed up and he finished in fourth place out of the trophies.

Some newer members may not know of Steve Crow—he was a player for

Another Title for Eddie

Cadet / U13 Open

espite a smallish entry, the Cippenham Cadet and Under-13 2-Star Open Championships ran successfully on 17 March, and like the massively entered New Year Festival in January, half of the winners' awards travelled afterwards down the M4 and into Wales. However, there was local success in the form of Eddie Mitchell.

Eddie did not drop a game all day in winning the Under-13 Boys' Singles. The top seed was flawless as he gave the local organizers something to cheer. The runner-up spot went to third seed Connor Neenan after he beat second seed Harry Lumb 15-13 in the fifth and deciding game.

The Welsh onslaught started in the under-13 events. Chloe Thomas headed a group of nine players to beat Tin-Tin Ho into second place and another regular visitor to Cippenham from Wales, Daniel O'Connell, beat Kent's Lumb in the final of the Cadet Boys' Singles. Later in the day Thomas was second to Jasmin Ould in the Cadet Girls' Singles.

The event was organized by Sue Hayes, refereed by Mick Strode, and attracted a total of 51 entries.



... and another also for Davis

Surrey's Steve Davis retained his Men's Single title at the Cippenham Veterans' 2-Star Open on 25 March. After losing the first game to third seed Fred Dove, Davis' twowinged attacking game then proved too strong for his Essex opponent and the second seed won the next two games comfortably and then clinched the title 12-10 in the fourth game. All the seeds progressed through their preliminary round groups comfortably enough, but after that did not prosper so well. The other two seeds both lost in the second round after receiving byes in the first round. Top seed Hari Gehlot fell in four games to an inspired Steve Giles while fourth seed Derek Holman fell three-straight to Graham Outrim. Hari's brother Ramesh restored the Gehlot family pride in the quarter-final, however, stopping Giles in his tracks. Ramesh then lost to Dove in the semi-final, the same stage

that Outrim's run finally came to an end at the hands of Davis.

Graham Trimming was the only member of the host club to make it out of the groups; the higher rated Mike Rhodes had to settle for the consolation event which he duly won beating Mike Wilkins in the final.

This was one tournament when the main interest did not centre around the men's event. After the preliminary groups of the Women's Singles, six women slogged it out in the knock-out stage and all five matches went the distance needing five games each to decide. The quarter-finals produced wins for Diane Melville 12-10 in the fifth against Sue Lang and for Amanda Alabaster 11-8 against Denise Weller. Melville followed this up with the shock of the tournament, an 11-9 fifth game win over top seed and defending

champion Regina

Donovan from Wales, while second seed Janet Brown's win over Alabaster was even tighter, 14-12 in the fifth. It was a surprise to no-one then that the final went the distance before Brown ran out winner 13-11 in the fifth.
