en Phillips, Head Coach at Cippen ham Table Tennis Club, is once again the English Table Tennis Association's Male Coach of the Year. The presentation was made by ETTA Chairman Alan Ransome during the awards dinner at Lilleshall National Sports Centre on 2nd September.

This award is only in its second year and amazingly Ken was won it both times. In accepting the award he paid tribute to the many other coaches working hard at Cippenham and said that it was testimony to the efforts of the whole team that the coaching set-up at the Club was so successful.

Cippenham Table Tennis Club has for a few years been identified as having the best coaching set-up in the country and over the past several years has produced a number of national champions and international players, especially amongst the youngest age groups. Players flock to Cippenham from all over the area, some travelling up to 100 miles to get the best coaching available. It shows in the success of the various teams supported by the Cippenham coaching scheme with Slough, Maidenhead and High Wycombe all having been very successful in national competitions in recent years. Slough League teams have won six junior and cadet national team titles in the past five years while the Maidenhead Association has won both national girls' events at U17 and U14 level in each of the last two years. For good measure the Cippenham club itself is the reigning Junior British League Girls' Premier Division champions.

In reading the citation for the award, ETTA Vice-Chairman of Teaching and Training, Gail McCulloch, remarked that the award could not be given to a more deserving person who has done a wonderful job. She then challenged other coaches in the country to attempt to take the trophy off Ken next year.

Great Start in the British League

Cippenham played superbly to exceed all expectations to take six out of eight possible points on debut in Division 1 South of the British League the last weekend in September. Cippenham earned promotion from their position as runners-up in Division 2 South last season and were expected to struggle in the higher echelon this time around. However the players responded magnificently to beat Ellenborough (Enfield) 7-1 and Limberlost Pine Poole 6-2. 4-4 draws with Horsham II and PSP Moonrakers I earned the Club an unbeaten record after the first weekend. Team captain Clive Payne was magnificent with 7 wins out of 8, while Martin Adams and Wesley Bush-Harris won five each. Mike Rhodes and Steve Joel both won half of their four matches.

The weekend got underway on Saturday morning with a fantastic 7-1 win over Ellenborough. The only defeat for Cippenham ironically proved to be Clive's only reverse of the weekend when he lost to Mike Levene. Two wins each for Martin, Wes and Steve eased Cippenham home. On Saturday afternoon Cippenham had to settle for a draw 4-4 with the PSP Moonrakers team from Westbury with Clive leading with a brace. Sunday morning, with Mike Rhodes in place of Steve Joel, started well again with Cippenham thrashing Poole 6-2 and then once again had to settle for a draw with Horsham.

Premier Division Status Unexpectedly Attained - But It's Tough! Women's British League

Cippenham teams fared only moder ately at the first weekend of the Women's British League held at Widnes over the weekend 9/10th September. Both teams were promoted above their finishing positions of last season and the first team were especially surprised when, upon their arrival at the venue, they found that they had been placed in the Premier Division after having finished second in Division Two last season and having leapfrogged their expected place in Division One.

Notwithstanding, the first team, without number one Sue Collier, who was unavailable through work commitments, did manage two draws from their five matches and their three losses were all by the small margin of 4-2. Kai Milvek, who flew in from her home in Estonia especially to play for Cippenham in the event, was the Slough club's most successful player. The World Veterans' Championship four times medallist won five of her eight sets and could have had two more. She was 20-16 up in the third against Samantha Marling, who plays for Cippenham in the Slough League, in the match against Hull. One additional point here would have turned a 3-3 draw into a 4-2 victory and improved the team's finishing position. In another match Kai was 8-0 up in the third when her opponent called "time-out" and the momentum was lost.

Thirteen-years old Joanna Parker also made her mark on her Premier Division debut. She won four of her eight matches including a win over Samantha and almost pulled off a sensational win over the 1999 English Junior champion Natalie Bawden but lost 21-19 in the third. Gemma Chapman put Saturday's poor form behind her to bounce back with two wins on Sunday but number one player Rebecca Fisher, an "import" from Essex, found the going too tough at the top of the order and won only one of her eight matches.

The second team finished third in Division Two with two wins and three losses, but lie a full five points behind the next team above. Team captain Claire Plumridge was the star of the show, winning six of her eight matches and losing only in the final match of the weekend. Ruth Bentley, playing at the number one position, won half of her eight matches while Jane Dickens won two out of six and Sue Hayes disappointingly only two out of eight.
