However, she and Gemmma both beat Liz May while Naomi beat Spink and also enjoyed a pivotal 3-2 win over Marketa Myskova to inflict the only defeat of the weekend over the Czech born star.

In the drawn match against Irish Ladies, Lesley piled on the pressure with two fifthgame victories over Tara Fusco and Michelle McGreevy while Naomi beat McGreevey 3-0. Neither Naomi nor Gemma could make much headway against the Irish number one Na Liu.

one position in the junior boys' list his own by winning the Irish junior boys' national title. David proceeded through two group stages before despatching seventh seed Dan Keenan in the quarter-final. In the semi-final it was third seed Keith Knox who succumbed before David secured his first national title by beating joint top seed Peter Graham. Such was David's dominance over a field that included all the top Irish players that each match was won 3-0, nobody even got a single game off the Cippenham protégé.

A week later it was much the same story as David won the U17 Boys' Singles at the Munster Open in Cork. His victim in this final was Keith Knox who once again went down 3-0. This five star event attracted another quality entry and for David it was double success for, in addition to winning the junior title, he finished fourth in the Men's Singles for his highest ever finish in a senior event.

The following weekend David was in action for the Irish junior national team in a match against Scotland at Drumchapel Table Tennis Club in Glasgow. Scotland beat Ireland 3-2 but David was responsible for the Irish successes, beating Scott Johnston 3-0 and sharing in a doubles win with Peter Graham over Johnston and Craig Howieson. However, the opening match ended in disappointment for David as he went down 3-1 to Howieson.

This match was a prelude to the West of Scotland Open in which David won the Men's Band 1 beating Damien Lynch, a player who represented Ireland in last year's World Championships, in the final but lost the finals of the Men's Under-21 to Peter Graham and the Junior Boys' Singles to Kenny Lindsey.

# **News in Short**

#### To the Finals of Carter Cup

Cippenham brothers Oliver and Ashley Shaw were unbeaten as Slough beat Milton Keynes 5-2 and South West Sussex 5-1 to clinch the local side a place in the finals of the Carter Cup, the national knock-out competition for junior boys' teams. Chalfont's Ben Wiseman deputised for Slough star David Hayes, who was representing Ireland in the West of Scotland Open. Assuming David is available for the finals in Derby in May, Slough must have some chance of regaining the title they won three times previously in 1997, 1998 and 2001.

#### But Elimination from Wilmott

The same cannot be applied to the men's team in the counterpart Wilmott Cup. Slough were represented by three Cippenham players, Mike Rhodes, Paul Baker and Oliver Shaw, and finished third in the group played at Ashford and therefore failed to qualify for the next round. Ollie and Mike won two each and Paul one in a 5-1 win over Maidenhead but only Ollie and Mike managed a win apiece in a 2-5 defeat to Staines and Mike was the only winner in the 1-5 reverse to West Middlesex.

## **Mixed Fortunes in BL 3rd Session**

There were mixed fortunes for Cippen ham's three teams in the British League over the weekend of  $15/16^{th}$  January. The first team drew one match and lost one other while the second and third teams both won one and lost one.

Playing at their home venue, the first team had a disappointing start to the session. Playing against the bottom team in Division 1 South De Vere NETTS, Cippenham went into a 0-5 deficit before making the score a more respectable 3-5 with wins for Mark Butler, Robert Hansell and Lee Dredge. NETTS went on to win their other match during the day to elevate themselves to fifth place, one below Cippenham.

The first team's second match was a much more encouraging draw against second-placed DML Woolwell from Plymouth. Lee earned the man of the match award with two wins against Marketa Myskova and Mike Short. Robert also beat Short and Martin Adams beat James Whiteman while Mark was disappointed to lose to Myskova but took the division's top ranked player Paul Whiting to deuce in the deciding fifth game and had a match point.

Also on home territory, the second team began with a 3-5 reverse against Division 2 South and Midlands leaders Bedford Modern. Mike Rhodes, making his first appearance of the season, and Paul Baker both beat the Bedford number four Steve Silk while Rob Lemon got the better of former Welsh number one Dave Welsman. Mark Jackson was unable to add to the score but made up for it with a brace in the second match against Ashford II. Rob and Paul also won their two matches to earn Cippenham a 6-2 win against the bottom placed team.

The third team travelled to the Woodfield Social and Sports Club in Wolverhampton and their below-strength team returned with two points from a possible four in Division 4 South and Midlands. London Progress V were beaten 6-2 in the first match with Nick Hansell and Phil Clarkson both bagging a brace. Ashley Shaw, on debut, also won one against Raphael Maron while Graham Trimming got his first win against the same player and had a match point also against Tony Alvarez.

In the afternoon match Cippenham put up a good show against divisional leaders Ellenborough II. Nick and Ashley, the latter at 12-10 in the fifth game after also having two match points in the fourth, both beat the Enfield team's number two Charlie Smith

### **Gainsford Elimination**

Cippenham are out of the Gainsford Cup, the national knock-out competition for women's teams. The three times national champions in 2002, 2003 and 2004 crashed out after the first hurdle on 2<sup>nd</sup> January but it could have been so different. Denied the services of Jane Dickens who, through her temporary residence at Birmingham University, had been unable to gain the necessary qualification through the Slough League, Cippenham fielded cadet Catherine Hayes in partnership with the established duo of Gemma Chapman and Sue Hayes.

In a group of four teams played at Ashford, Middlesex, Cippenham first beat a two-player Le Roi team from North Herts 5-2 with Sue and Gemma winning one each. The crunch came in the second match against Hastings club Hollington. The final result of 4-5 hinged upon Gemma's loss, her first in four years in the competition, to Rose Rainton. Gemma won her other two matches as did Sue with Catherine unable to add to the score.

The final match brought another defeat for Cippenham, 3-5 to the hosts, and another defeat for Gemma, beaten by Sarah Horsnell when the score stood at 3-3. Sue, paradoxically, beat Horsnell but lost to Sharon Mitchell.

The men's team, playing in the counterpart Ormesby Cup, fared better in terms of qualification but not so on the table. With the Rowhedge team from Colchester failing to arrive because of an administrative lapse, the hosts Cippenham were engaged only against Ashford. The match was lost 1-5 with David Hayes beating Tony Holmes for Cippenham's only success. Paul Baker and Ollie Shaw were unable to add to the score but it mattered little as the rules provided for two teams to progress into the next round.

# Melanie Retains her U16 Title

Cippenham's England cadet international Melanie Farquhar retained her Under-16 Girls' Singles title at the Cippenham Under-14/16 1-Star Open Championships on 9th January. The top seed, who should have been heads and shoulders above the rest of the field, struggled in the final however and had to reverse a two games to love deficit to beat Sussex player Stacey Furnival. The beaten semi-finalists were Charlotte Callcut, who eliminated Melanie's sister Rachel in the quarter-final, and Ayonija Sundararajan.

The counterpart Boys' Singles final was contested between two players from Middlesex with Suchira Gallage using his consistent two-wing top-spin attack to defeat the less orthodox Raphael Marom. In the semi-finals Gallage beat the Welsh player Patrick Thomas while Marom ended the impressive run of Cippenham's England Schools international player Eddie Mitchell. Neither of the top two seeds made it past the quarters: Billy Deville being beaten by Marom and Danny Flash by Thomas. Cippenham's Andrew Linz also won his group and made it through the quarters where he lost to Gallage.

Earlier in the day Marom had also lost in the final of the Under-14 Boys' Singles, this time to Patrick Thomas. Andrew Linz had a storming win over top seed Deville in the quarters but then fell to Marom in the semi-final while Thomas' victim at that stage was Milan Dragojlovic. Oh! for a similar result, rather than the draw, back in September that would have resulted in Cippenham becoming Women's British League champions for the first time.

Sunday brought two more victories for Cippenham, a routine 6-0 win over a weak Blackpool side that included Cippenham member and Slough resident Jane Dickens, and 4-2 over the Woodfield team from Wolverhampton. Naomi lost to Jose Bongers in the latter match whereas Lesley had a good win over the same player and an impressive 3-0 win over Janet Johns (nee Dunning). Gemma also impressed with a 3-2 win over Karen Smith in the opening set of the match.
