# Mixed Results as the British League comes to Cippenham

rippenham Table Tennis Centre played host to two divisions of the British League for the third session of matches over the weekend of 16/17th March. There were mixed results for the host club's two teams with the second team putting in average performances and achieving good results while the first team, paradoxically, played well for less reward. Both teams began the weekend in second position in their respective divisions but, whereas the "B" team strengthened its position in Division 3 South and finished three points clear of the third-placed team, the "A" team slipped a place in Division 1 South.

The "A" team started the weekend well with a good 6-2 win over the Enfieldbased club Ellenborough on Saturday afternoon. Martin Adams and Clive Payne were both in top form and each won two supported by one win each from Mark Butler and Brian Burn. The result was aided in no small way by two consecutive wins by 11-9 the fifth and deciding game. Next came a match against champions London Progress II. Clive again excelled and when he won his second match 11-9 in the fifth against James Sprackling, whom Mark had also beaten, it looked possible that the host team would achieve a great result. Martin then went 2-1 up against Eli Baraty but could not quite convert a deuce into victory in the fourth and then missed out also by 11-9 in the fifth.

Cippenham had a walkover on Sunday morning against a Barnet team devoid of players and had to replace the injured Clive with second team player Mike Rhodes for the afternoon's showdown with DML Plymouth, a match destined to go a long way in deciding second place.

In a fantastic match full of full-flowing ultra-competitive table tennis that outlasted all the other matches in the hall, the unjust result was a 8-0 whitewash for the Devon side. Cippenham can count themselves extremely unlucky having taken six of the eight sets to a deciding game.

Cippenham's second team began with a less than convincing 5-3 victory over bottom team York Gardens. The Batterseabased team extended Cippenham fully and the host team had a brace from 13-years old debutant David Hayes and a close 11-9 in the fifth win for Mark Banks over Rhyan Nelson to spare their blushes. Mark Jackson and Robert Hansell also chipped in with a win apiece. The shakiness continued with a 4-4 draw against a Byng Hall Farningham Print III team that could only muster three players. One more from David and a win by Mike Rhodes were added to two gifts against

the Tunbridge Wells team that finished four places below in the table.

Robert Lemon and Paul Baker came into the side on Sunday to team up with Mark Jackson and Robert and the team functioned much better. The two matches were both won 6-2: against Britannia Hanbury FP Ipswich in the morning and Horsham III in the afternoon. Robert Lemon was superb throughout, winning all four of his matches while Robert Hansell won two against Ipswich and Mark Jackson did likewise against Horsham. The final match was the team's best display and did much to secure a second position that should be easy to defend when the final two matches are played in April.

The weekend was organised by Cippenham General Secretary Graham Trimming and referred by Ken Phillips.

# KEN AND MIKE ARE HONOURED



Two members of Cippenham Table Tennis Club's management team were presented with richly-deserved awards prior to the British League matches on Sunday 17th March. Club Chairman Ken Phillips and Bookings Officer Mike Rhodes were both the recipients of the English Table Tennis Association's Merit Award. The qualification for the award is no less than ten years' outstanding service and the awards were made as much for service to the Slough and District League in the case of Mike, and to the Buckinghamshire County Table Tennis Association in the case of Ken, as to the Cippenham club.

#### Specially outstanding service

Ken is now widely known throughout the country through his prowess as a top coach and his role as Chairman of Cippenham Table Tennis Club. He regularly spends 60 hours a week on table tennis duties and has done so since retiring from full-time employment about eight years ago. Ken's forte is in coaching, which he took up in 1986. He is Level 4 (senior) qualified and is a tutor and assessor of student coaches. He is head coach to the Southern Region and has received the following coaching awards:

Sport England Volunteer Coach of the Year in an Individual Sport in 2000

ETTA Male Coach of the Year (twice) in 1999 and 2000 Slough Borough Council Coach of the Year (twice) in 1994 and 2000.

In addition, Ken is Chairman of one of England's busiest clubs where he extends his role of Chairman to incorporate much more: liaison with school landlord; negotiations with kit and equipment suppliers; control of kit and equipment supplies; tournament organiser and referee and much more besides. He also organises and coaches most of the junior teams for Cippenham, Slough and Buckinghamshire that have been very successful on the national stage in recent years. Ken is a qualified Tournament Referee and County Umpire.

The citations for the awards were read by Cippenham TTC General Secretary Graham Trimming, himself a previous recipient of the award, and presented by ETTA Facilities Officer Paul Baker who happens also to be a member of Cippenham.

Mike was also the recipient of a salver presented by the Cippenham club. Mike's job has moved to Southampton and he will shortly be moving home. The award was to say "thank you" for the tremendous contribution Mike has made to the Club over very many years. The award was unexpected by Mike but richly decorated.

#### Specially outstanding service

Because of work commitments Mike is leaving the Slough area. Such is his day-to-day involvement in running Cippenham Table Tennis Centre that he will be more difficult to replace than any other of Cippenham's hard-working management team (including those more well-known nationally). Mike joined Cippenham TTC in 1988 after having returned to the sport after an absence of nearly 20 years. He became Slough League Inter-League Secretary in 1990 and held that office for ten years until taking over as Press Secretary in 2000.

When Cippenham TTC was in need of a new Bookings Officer in 1992 after a few mishaps the Club appointed the person most likely to make a big difference – Mike. He has held that office ever since and with the creation of Cippenham Table Tennis Centre the role expanded significantly to one of overall control for the day-to-day management of the Centre i.e. controlling bookings, appointing duty officers, ensuring that the Centre is opened at the appropriate time and is always on hand to set-up equipment for the weekend activities.

Mike is also the organizer of the Cippenham 2-Star Open Championships. For services to table tennis, Mike was awarded the Coral Racing Trophy by the Slough League in 1993.

# Bucks Save Premier Division Status

A Buckinghamshire county team, comprised entirely of Cippenham players, secured their continued place in the Junior Premier Division of the County Championships with three victories over the weekend 23<sup>rd</sup>/24<sup>th</sup> March. After a dismal first weekend in November the Bucks team, missing England Under-12 champion Bradley Evans, who was away training in China, needed to vastly improve their results. Led by great performances from James Milton and Gemma Chapman, who each lost only once during the weekend, Bucks won their first three matches. Warwickshire and Yorkshire were both defeated 8-2 and when Cheshire were beaten 6-4, a defeat that cost Cheshire the title, the threat of relegation was eclipsed. It then mattered little that Bucks lost 7-3 to Surrey in the final match to finish in fifth place. The other Bucks players, David Hayes, Emily Tucker and Warren Brooks also performed well in a good team performance.
