A better weekend for our teams in the British League

All three Cippenham teams enjoyed better results in the second weekend of matches in the British League. The first team took five points from eight to move into fourth place in Division 1 South while the second team took three points to move off the bottom of Division 1 South and Midlands while the third team's first win of the season moved them away from the foot of Division 2 South & West.

The first team squad travelled to Okehampton in Devon for the weekend, a long trek that is traditionally not a fruitful one, and with team availability issues for the Saturday it seemed the trend may continue. However the team spirit was present in droves and Cippenham piled on the points with minimal damage suffered.

The first match saw the Cippenham three of Cedric Brion, Martin Adams and Owen Clutterbuck face BATTs II. The highly rated Ryan Collins was the only thorn in Cippenham's side as he came through in tough matches with Martin and Cedric. However this was matched by a fine double from Owen, who was never in any trouble, to bring an opening 4-4 draw to get the first points of the weekend on the board for Cippenham.

Cippenham went one better in the encounter with bottom-placed TTK Greenhouse. Again Owen shone with a double to remain unbeaten for the day. Cedric also won the crucial clash with the talented Jerome Jonah and then Martin came through against the very vocal Fatlum Sadiku to seal a 5-3 victory and ensure that the team could enjoy their sleep.

With the squad being restored to full strength for the Sunday matches with the return of Mark Butler, the crucial Sunday morning match with York Gardens saw Martin put in a true captain's performance which started with a win over York Gardens' top player Chris Lewis. This put the momentum firmly with Cippenham as they raced to a 4-0 lead. The second half honours were shared with wins for Martin and Owen, once again remaining unbeaten, to seal a 6-2 victory and virtually ensure any worries of relegation were expelled.

A strong Pavilion Brighton squad thoroughly deserved their 7-1 victory in the afternoon despite some close ties, but not before Cedric gave Cippenham the early lead in disposing of the highly-rated Ashley Stokes in four games with a bout of high quality attacking forehand loops.

Best performance by far of the weekend in a Cippenham shirt came at their own Slough venue from Robert Hansell who won all eight of his matches for Cippenham seconds. Robert now lies second in the divisional averages with 13 wins from 16 for the season thus far. Sadly, his team-mates could not match his effort and Rafique Sarhadi, albeit playing in the difficult number one position, has yet to win at all in fourteen matches. Eddie Mitchell

put a spell of indifferent form behind him for a great performance on the Sunday, winning all four of his matches in support of Robert. This culminated in a 4-4 draw with Fusion II on Saturday morning and then, assisted by Steve Munson's win over Jason Tendler, a 5-3 win over local rivals Ashford to leapfrog over the Staines-based team at the bottom of the division. Earlier, on the Saturday, Cippenham II had slipped to two defeats against OLOP IMPACT 5-3, when Steve had a good win against Neil Wright to add to Robert's brace and 6-2 against the Guernsey national side when Steve's 12-10 fifth-game loss to Oliver Langlois was the closest any Cippenham player came to providing Robert with the support he needed.

The Cippenham third team travelled the short distance to Ashford for their matches and their highlight was a 5-3 victory against Fusion III. Team captain Paul Baker was the star for Cippenham with wins against Kinga Oryl and Neil Stewart while Martin Haycock, Chris Hansell and Ricky Hardcastle, playing with more maturity than when making his debut in the first weekend, provided great support with one win each in a closely fought match.

Other results were not so encouraging with Ricky providing the sole success in a 7-1 defeat against Bournemouth Sports, who included current England national team player Hannah Hicks, on Saturday morning. Only Chris Hansell played both days with Steve Buck, Tony Stead and Steve Smith coming into the side for the Sunday matches. Steve Buck and Tony both tasted success in a 6-2 defeat against Horsham while Steve was later the only victor in a 7-1 loss to Woolwell II.

With half of the fixtures completed in the Maidenhead League, the Premier Division title race is really hot. Only two points separate the top three teams (in a division only containing five teams) although third-placed Kingfisher have played one match more than their Cippenham rivals.

Our two teams are first and second in the division with Saxons holding the narrowest one-point advantage over Spartans at the Christmas break. Spartans must be rueing the fact they have fielded only two players on three occasions and, ironically, two of these matches were against Spartans. After gifting six points in this way Spartans are doing well to remain in touch.

Last year's Wilkinson Sword winner, Simon Wilde, is an ever present for Spartans, with only Ricky Hardcastle of the remaining squad members having played in more than three matches. There is no doubt that if the strongest three, Ricky, Eddie Mitchell and Tony Stead, were to play every week then the destiny of the title would have already been decided. However, Tony has managed only one appearance and Eddie three. Ricky's thirteen wins from fourteen matches sees him placed at the top of the League's averages.

Saxons, on the other hand, are more consistent with all five members of the squad having played between four and six matches. Matt Brown and captain Paul Baker each have averages in the 80s while Graham Trimming, making his first appearances in the Maidenhead League for several years, has also won important games. Steve Smith and Tanya Waller are the other members of the squad.

Take a look at the Division 2 table! Just one point separates the bottom four teams but, unfortunately, it is Trojans that lie bottom with an inferior sets aggregate giving played two more matches than their rivals. Only Denise Weller has managed a better than 50% average in a tough and competitive division.

Vikings are in the middle of another competitive division although Cookham Social Typhoons, with a squad of players with former Premier Division experience, are walking away with the title. For Vikings, David Williams has
