England go down to Germany ... again!

E uropean League champions Germany again proved their dominance over the rest of the continent with a 4-1 mauling of England at Cippenham Table Tennis Centre on October 28th.


Having already qualified from their group for the semi-finals, Germany had the luxury of resting all of their top four established stars for this latest encounter with England. Into their team came Christina Fischer, normally a reserve to the top four, Cornelia Bottcher making only her second international appearance (the first was at Cippenham in January), and 17 year old debutant Tanya Hoffman.

England were without the ill Andrea Holt but were otherwise at full strength, with Lisa Lomas, Helen Lower and Nicola Deaton.

This was the third international match to be played at Cippenham in less than a year and was witnessed by a crowd approaching 100.

Although the result was 4-1 in the German's favour, the match was closer than the score suggests and might conceivably have gone to the home side. The loss of Holt was a severe blow as not only did it rob England of one of their more experienced players, but the team was also without its normal doubles pairing.

The match began with an exciting tussle beatween Nicola Deaton and Christina



Fischer. Deaton did extremely well to pull back from 15-20 down in the first game but could not win the deuce points. The second was also very tight, going to the German 23-21.

Lisa Lomas equalised the scoreline for England with a three game win over Cornelia Bottcher, but Helen Lower failed to impress with a below par performance against the determined Tanya Hofmann.

A doubles win for the Germans made it 3-1 and they wrapped it all up in the next match as Christina Fischer got the better of former European silver medallist Lisa Lomas in the most attractive match of the evening. On this occasion the defensive skills of Lomas were not quite able to overcome the power of Fischer.

Once again the Centre received much praise for the manner in which these matches are presented.



Honours shared at Handicap Tournament

The five main events at this season's annual Handicap Tournament on October 25th produced a maximum eight winners to the delight of the Club's Handicapping Committee of Ken Phillips, Rhys Evans and Graham Trimming who did a magnificent job equalising the prospects of all the competitors.

The Senior Handicap Singles produced a fantastic win for Frank Earis who being the highest ranked and most handicapped player in the tournament had to overcome massive starts against most of his opponents. The final between Frank and Jane Dickens was a memorable match as Frank overcame the loss of the first game and a huge deficit in the second to win that game 22-20 and the third by the narrow margin of 21-19.

The counterpart junior event was won by 11 year old Andrew ("Skip") Dickens who beat Josey McNamara in an entertaining final.

The Senior Doubles event was won by a junior pairing of Ben Beveridge and Claire Maher, while the Junior Doubles brought Tom Whale and David Hayes their first table tennis trophies.

The most intriguing event, as ever, was the Top 'n' Tail Doubles in which the top and the bottom players are paired. However, as is often the case, it was a middle pairing which won the event, namely Simon Parnell and James Read.

Overall, the competition proved very enjoyable to the record entry. This is the first time for three years that the handicap events have been divorced from the main Club Championship - so next April's event will not be so cluttered with events!


