Another Golden Moment for Gavin in Strasbourg

Euro U12 Title for Gavin

Gavin Evans, a member of England's gold medal winning cadet boys' team at the recent European Youth Championships is at it again! This time the event was the European Mini Championships for under-12s played at Strasbourg at the end of August. Once again, Gavin demonstrated that he could be destined for greatness by winning the event and so adding a second European gold medal to his tally in as many months.

Gavin was undoubtedly the star of the event. He moved comfortably into the quarter-finals with 3-0 victories over Kerebel (FRA), Balbukov (RUS), Barabarov (BLR) and Spiess (GER). He showed superior touch play and gave his opponents massive problems with his serves.

Gavin dropped the first game in the quarter-final against Swede Sam Coellin but showed excellent mental strength to recover and win comfortably in four games. In the semi-final he had to battle against a vociferous French crowd supporting their local player and despite dropping the second game, Gavin ran out a clear four-game winner silencing the 300 strong crowd by winning the fourth game 11-0!

Gavin saved his best performance for the final with a devastating 3-0 victory over Swede Anthony Tran, a player who had taken Gavin to five games in the recent Cadet Six Nations. Gavin



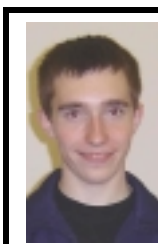

showed the signs of a true champion, being able to produce his best table tennis in the biggest game and demonstrated that, at the moment, he is well on course to becoming a star of world table tennis in the future.

Hayes Family Dominates County Trials

The Hayes family started the new table tennis season in the same way that they finished the last—dominating the local scene. Irish national junior champion David Hayes, and his sister Catherine, the English national cadet girls' doubles champion, won their respective sections at the Buckinghamshire Junior Trials held at their home club on 3rd September.

There was a one-two-three for Cippenham in the boys' event with David Hayes being followed by Ashley Shaw and Ben Wiseman while in the girls' event another Cippenham youngster, Angela Oetiker, was placed third.

Solid Starts for WBL Teams

Both Cippenham's teams made solid starts in their Women's British League campaigns at Hereford over the weekend of 24/25th September. Their records were identical with six points each out of ten, having won three matches and losing two.

The first team are in the same position that they finished last season—third in the Premier Division. They recorded 4-2 wins over the three teams below them—Irish Ladies, Leeds and Wirral Premier, but lost 5-1 to the teams in first and second positions, DML Woolwell (Plymouth) and London Progress. Woolwell lead the way with an unblemished ten points while Cippenham lie in third place, one point behind London Progress and one better off than the Irish.

Local girl Gemma Chapman, from Maidenhead, was the star player for Cippenham winning six of her ten matches including important braces in the narrow wins over the Irish and Leeds. New signing Abigail Embling, the England junior international from Essex and a replacement in the original squad for Marina Zarzycka, and veteran Lesley Keast both won four times and it was Abigail who won her two to secure the similarly narrow victory over Wirral.

Cippenham's new second team were placed into Division Three, one above the basement. The two losses were against the top two sides, Ormesby

(Middlesborough) and Guernsey both by 4-2. By contrast, Cippenham's three wins were more emphatic, 6-0 against local rivals Ashford and 5-1 against both Uxbridge (Burton) and Marston. These results assisted Cippenham to an identical sets aggregate of 20 for and 10 against with the top two teams but the three and two points deficit will be difficult to overcome while the season concludes in the new year.

England Junior Masters champion Melanie Farquhar, from Charvil, and Slough's Sue Hayes both won seven of their ten matches while another junior, Caroline Linz, impressed with six.

21 Points out of 24 as British League Teams Make Impressive Start

Cippenham's three teams all made excellent starts to the new season during the first week-end of the British League season over the week-end of 10/11th September.

Pride of place goes to the second team, which won all four of its matches to share top spot in Division 2 South and Midlands with Progress III, four points clear of third placed Oxford. Playing at Cippenham, Saturday saw two excellent 7-1 victories over Bedford Modern II and Kingshurst Bribar. Debutant Diccon Gray and 'super-sub' Nick Hansell both won all their matches while David Hayes and Paul Baker both won three out of four. The competition was fiercer on Sunday as a new look team secured a 6-2 win over Ashford I in the morning and followed up with a 5-3 defeat of ESB-Orange Northampton II in the afternoon. David won two while Mark Jackson, Mike Rhodes and new boy Steve Buck all contributed three out of four.

Cippenham's first team also made a strong start to the season with three victories and one defeat, which leaves them in third place in Division I South, behind early leaders Woolwell I and Fusion I. The team of Martin Adams, Robert Hansell, Mark Butler and Robert Lemon played unchanged at their home club throughout the week-end to beat Oxford Fireplace Centre I and De Vere NETTS 6-2 on Saturday and London Progress II 5-3 on Sunday afternoon. Their only reverse coming against the strong DML Woolwell first team on Sunday morning. Overall Mark won six of his eight matches, Martin and Rob Hansell five and Rob Lemon four in a good all-round performance.

The third team, playing at the Southall

Table Tennis Centre, lead Division 4 South and West outright after three wins and a draw. Things started well with a convincing 5-3 win over Southampton West, with Cippenham going 5-0 up thanks to two wins from number one Phil Clarkson and one each by Oliver and Ashley Shaw and Ben Wiseman. Saturday afternoon saw a hard fought draw with second placed DML Woolwell II with number four Ben winning twice including the vital last match to secure the point. On Sunday Paul Baker came into the team at number one as the team raced to a 7-1 win over Brighton III, with Paul, Phil and Oliver winning twice and a 6-2 win over Guinness Polska II with Paul and Phil again winning twice and the Shaw brothers once each.

All three teams now look forward to tough encounters against their closest rivals in each division during the second week-end of matches in December.
