Another prestigious national award comes to the Club

Jacquie is Volunteer of the Year

Cippenham Table Tennis Club received another massive boost at the beginning of September with a prestigious award given to Jacquie Lovell, the Club's Social Officer. At the English Table Tennis Association's annual awards dinner Jacquie was presented with the coveted Volunteer of the Year Award in recognition of the fantastic service she has given to the Club over the past eight years.

For the entire period since the opening of the purpose-built £520,000 Cippenham Table Tennis Centre in 1996, Jacquie has been the Social Officer with responsibility for managing the Club's catering activities. This includes purchasing, preparing and dispensing the vast amount of food consumed during busy weekend tournaments and being one of the licensees for the bar that is open on senior training evenings. The catering alone at the Club has a turnover of around £10,000 p.a.

Cippenham Club Secretary Graham Trimming said "We are all very proud of Jacquie and her achievements and thrilled that she has been recognised by the national association in such a public and prestigious way. It is Jacquie's contribution that makes Cippenham Table Tennis Centre such a vibrant and welcoming place during weekend tournaments and the reason why so many players from all over the country love to play at Cippenham."

Jacquie herself was thrilled with the honour and cited it as an incentive to carry on with her good work.

It is not just in the catering side that Jacquie has demonstrated her management capabilities. A qualified human resources manager, she is also the Club's Volunteer Champion with the remit to recruit, train and retain the army of volunteer staff so necessary in running such a large and successful sports club. She has also written the Club's child protection policy and is responsible for recruiting and managing the Club's paid duty officer.

During the past ten months Jacquie has also taken on another role, that of liaison with the host Westgate School and its building contractors in the management of the building extensions to the lounge and kitchen areas at the Table Tennis Centre. This has meant many meetings on site to thrash out the minutia of the works and also to design and manage the fitting out of the kitchen, successfully completed by Club members Alan Farral and Terry Boxall.

British League Gets Underway

The new table tennis season got underway the first weekend of September with the first big event since the upgrading of the facilities at Cippenham Table Tennis Centre. The host club's top two men's teams were both in action while the newly created third team traveled to Southall for the first weekend of matches in the British League.

Robert Hansell celebrated his promotion into the first team for this season by winning five of his eight matches as Cippenham I won one, drew two and lost one other of their four matches. Saturday started a little disappointingly with two draws against sides expected to be near the bottom of the table at the end of the season. All four Cippenham players, Martin Adams, Mark Butler, Robert Hansell and Lee Dredge got off the mark in the first match against B.F.I.T. Wiltshire and Martin just missed out on giving Cippenham both points when he fell to his opposing number one Eddie Roofe 11-9 in the fifth and deciding game. Cippenham were 2-0 and 3-1 up before Wiltshire pegged the final score back to 4-4. In the afternoon match against the De Vere NETTS team from Essex, promoted into Division One South this season, Martin bagged a brace but Mark failed to score. Robert and Lee managed one win each but the difference between winning and drawing the match came down to Lee's 13-11 fifth-game loss to Steve Kerns and Robert's 11-9 fifth-game loss to Fred Dove.

If Saturday was a disappointment then Sunday morning was a different story with a great 6-2 win over the fancied DML Woolwell team from Devon. Star player the previous day Martin took a back seat in this match with two defeats while Mark, Robert and Lee all bagged braces. The most exciting contest was Lee against the veteran Mike Short which the Cippenham player won 14-12 in the fifth while Mark's four-game win over the opposing number one Paul Whiting was the outstanding contribution to Cippenham's victory. In the afternoon Cippenham led rivals London Progress II 2-1 at one time before going down 5-3 with Martin, Robert and Lee win-

ning one apiece. Robert had a particularly good 11-9 fifth-game win over James Sprackling but the turning point was a disputed match point Mark held over Henry Medellin in the fourth game before losing the fifth.

The Cippenham second team also gained four points from the weekend and this was enough for them to be placed in third place in Division 2 South and Midlands. It was a rounded team performance with David Hayes, Mark Jackson and Rob Lemon all winning five of their eight matches with Paul Baker only one behind with four. The weekend got off to a flying start with a comprehensive 7-1 victory over EBS-Orange Northampton II. David lost the opening set to allow Northampton an early lead but then it was all Cippenham even though Paul (twice), Mark and Rob needed five games to win some of their matches. In fact, Paul came back from 2-0 down and deuce in the third to win in five against Mark Purcell and Rob only beat Dannel Pang 11-9 in the fifth. The scores were reversed on Saturday afternoon as Cippenham suffered a 7-1 defeat at the hands of division leaders Bedford Modern. David managed to beat Bedfords's number one Keiron Dabbs 11-5 in the fifth but David, against Dave Welsman, and Paul, against Mick Harper, suffered back-to-back 11-9 fifth-game losses to deny any hope the host club may have had for any points.

Cippenham were back on form on Sunday morning with an 8-0 trouncing of local rivals Ashford II although three sets did require a deciding game. Mark excelled in this match to win both his sets three-straight. The luck turned again in the afternoon as Cippenham failed to get off the starting blocks and were soon 4-0 down to second-placed Guildford. The revival then began with David, Mark and Rob all winning their final matches to bring the score to 4-3 but Paul was unable to capitalise on this and his loss to Devesh Shete confirmed a 5-3 defeat.

Cippenham's new third team were placed in

Division 4 South and Midlands and traveled to the new London Progress Tournament Centre at Southall for their matches. The weekend started well with an 8-0 eclipse of Guinness Polska II with only James Milton and Nick Hansell extended to even a fourth game. From 2-0 up it was three-straight all the way as Chris Hansell and Ollie Shaw joined in the fun. Saturday afternoon's match was a little harder but the two Hansells and James all got maximums in the 6-2 win over hosts London Progress V. Closest games were the fourth and fifth sets in which Chris beat Michael Persaud 11-9 in the fifth and James beat Danny Flash 11-7 in the fifth.

Sunday was a much more difficult day with two 5-3 results, one favourable and one not. The morning's defeat to a strong Ellenborough II side saw the veteran Nick return without a win although he did extend Marc Armstrong to 11-8 in the fifth. James, Chris and Ollie, who enjoyed a good win over Chris Marlow, won the matches for Cippenham. Nick, though, came good in the afternoon and it was his brace that made the difference in Cippenham's 5-3 win over Nottingham IV. After Nick had beaten Ellis 11-5 in the fifth it signalled both points for Cippenham who led at that time 5-1. The younger Hansell, Chris, James and Ollie all contributed one win each.

George Appleby 1911-2004

It is with great sadness that we report the passing of George at Wexham Park Hospital on 19th August, 93 years after his birth in Burnley, Lancashire. George made 372 appearances for Cippenham between 1985 and 1998 and was a popular character who continued playing into his late eighties.

George was an engineer by trade but well into retirement by the time he joined the Club where he teamed up again with former team-mate Georgia Veneer.
