Third Place For Ladies at Half-Way Stage

Cippenham made a good start to the Women's British League campaign at Grantham over the weekend of September 7/8th. As champions of Division 1 last season, promotion to the Premier Division was met with the need to strengthen the team. Gemma Chapman and Becky Hurrell (nee Fisher) remained from the previous season and former Welsh international Lesley Keast (she played in the 1985 and 1989 World Championships) added her considerable experience.

Cippenham eventually finished in third position in the eight-team division with six points from two wins and two draws. The starting point was a 3-3 draw with Eagle Printers, a match in which all three Cippenham ladies won a match but found the Czech player Marketa Myskova a more daunting prospect. This was followed by the weekend's first victory, 4-2 over Leeds. Claire News won her two for the losing team while Gemma did likewise for Cippenham. Saturday concluded with a 0-6 defeat at the hands of league leaders Grove who lost only one set all weekend. Grove included a Chinese player Zhao Shuang at number one.

Sunday got off to a great start with Irish Ladies being dealt a severe blow 5-1. Only Becky suffered defeat here although Lesley had to fight hard to defeat Linda Mountjoy 3-2. The weekend finished as it had started with a draw. This time it was Grove's second team and all three Cippenham players again scored a win to turn a 0-2 deficit into a 3-2 lead.

The second weekend is again at Grantham in January.

Both Teams Off To A Good Start in British League

Both Cippenham teams made good starts to the new British League season over the weekend of 31st August and 1st September. Playing on home territory Cippenham "A" had three wins and one defeat from their four matches in Division 1 South while the "B" team exceeded expectations with two victories and a draw in Division 2 South. The "A" team currently lies third in the division while the "B" team is fourth.

The season could not have started brighter for Cippenham "A" who demolished De Vere NETTS (North Essex) 8-0 in the opening match on Saturday afternoon. Only Lee Dredge, making his Cippenham debut, was at all stretched, having to come back from two games down to defeat Andrew Doshier. This performance earned Lee the "Man of the Match" award. Richard Tilford, also on debut, started well in the number one position and was well supported by Martin Adams and Clive Payne. The later Saturday match produced a showdown with last year's divisional champions London Progress II but this resulted in Cippenham's only lost points of the weekend. It all came down to the fifth game of the last set in which Lee once more came back from two games down but, this time, did not have the edge in the fifth and succumbed to Darek Zurowski. Cippenham's wins came from Richard and Clive, who both had good wins over Eli Baraty, and Martin who beat Daniel Feshation. Progress' Paralympic double gold medallist Taj Agunbiade won twice for the victors. Ironically, Progress were weaker on the Sunday while Cippenham had their first choice team available so if the match had been delayed 24 hours the result might well have been different.

With first choice Mark Butler replacing Lee on Sunday, the "A" team secured two more wins to end on a satisfactory note. All four players won as Cippenham raced into a 4-0 lead over Enfield-based Ellenborough. Nerves jangled

as the visitors came back to 4-3 before Clive got the extra point with a three-straight win over Matthew Spero. The weekend finished with a 6-2 win over EBS-Orange Northampton I. Richard and Mark both won their two matches while Martin and Clive picked up the others.

Cippenham's second team of mostly young players did themselves proud after gaining promotion last year. In the first match against EBS-Orange Northampton II the top of the team, Mark Jackson and Robert Hansell, won all their matches while of the two cadet players David Hayes won one and lost the other at deuce in the fifth but James Milton disappointed by scoring a duck. It was a different story later in the day as Cippenham made little impact on PSP Westinsure, who were last season playing in Division 1, and lost 7-1 with only David Hayes on the scoresheet.

Robert was retained in the team for the Sunday matches and was joined by Lee Dredge, released from first team duty, and juniors Robert Lemon and Gemma Chapman. All four players tasted victory as a 4-4 draw was earned against Horsham II from 2-4 down. Later, Cippenham scored a tremendous 5-3 victory over Hastings who had earlier been the only team to deny PSP Westinsure full points. Lee led the team from the front with two wins, including an 11-9 fifth game win over Paul Barry, and Robert Lemon also got his brace. They were supported with a fifth-game win for Robert Hansell over Nick Standen.

The weekend was organised by Graham Trimming, refereed by Graham and Ken Phillips while Ken and Dave Bull both provided valuable administrative assistance.
