First team top WBL division

The Cippenham women's first team won all five of their matches in Wolverhampton to lead Division 3 of the Women's British League at the half-way stage. The team, comprising two sixteen years-olds and a fourteen years-old, will be hoping to retain that position and gain the promotion they narrowly missed out on last season.

Rachael Iles, Cippenham's number one player demonstrated why she is ranked twenty-two in the country, by winning all her matches while Mia Lakhani, two years younger and only four places lower in the national rankings, won nine of her ten encounters. They were ably supported by Anna Piercey who weighed in with six wins.

The successful run began on Saturday morning with a 5-1 success over Greenhouse, the powerhouse club from London. Rachael and Mia won both their matches and whilst Anna won only one, that one included an 11-0 demolition of Sylwia Pajak. The Graham Spicer team from New Malden then felt the full force of Cippenham's power succumbing to a 6-0 scoreline that was nearly as easy as it sounds. Saturday's play concluded with another 5-1 victory, this time over Loop Dublin as the Irish team were no match for Rachael and Mia although Yixue Bai did manage to get the better of Anna.

Sunday's two matches started in similar vein. A storming display from Rachael lles who put aside Sally Hughes and Lok Sze Sun both 3-0, conceding only thirty-seven points in the process, was supplemented by wins for both Mia Lakhani and Anna Piercey over Holly Holder. The final match of the weekend produced another 5-1 success for Cippenham over Colebridge 2 with Rachael and Mia again remaining unbeaten. Over the weekend's five matches, Rachael received three player of the match awards while the other two were awarded to Mia.

Meanwhile, the Cippenham second team, comprised of veteran players, occupied a mid-table position in Division 4. Mary Heffernan, despite playing in the more difficult number one position, was the standout player for Cippenham, winning seven of her ten matches while Sue



Hayes won five, Julie Dean four out of eight and Denise Weller, troubled by injury, one out of two. Over the weekend Cippenham won two matches, drew one and lost the remaining two.

The opening match was a closely-fought encounter with Jersey with three of the six sets requiring a deciding game.
