# Nick is the star as Team Open Coconuts beat the ice

Christmas!



A Welsh partnership of Neil Wright and Nick Brown, disguised as the Cardiff Coconuts, took a rather unconventional route to beat the icy weather and win the Cippenham Team 2-Star Open the last Sunday in November. When your number one player only wins six of his eleven matches it places great burden on the number two in the short punchy format of best of three individual matches to decide the team result. However, Cippenham's British League star Nick Brown rose to the occasion to win six of his seven matches as the Coconuts recovered from potential disaster early in the day.

It was an inauspicious start. Coconuts were seeded second for the event and expected to win their group. However, St. Michael's B had other ideas. Jerome Jonah, who was one of four players to remain undefeated all day began by beating Neil Wright 3-1. The real shock came straight afterwards as Nick fell by a similar score to Raphael Lawanson. This was Nick's only defeat in the competition and was against a youngster with no prior senior points on the national ranking list.

That defeat placed Cardiff Coconuts second in the group and facing a playoff with OLOP IMPACT. Defeat would have meant that their highest finishing position would have been ninth, the place that OLOP ultimately filled. Wright lost the opening match against the impressive young defender Daniel Moses but Nick and Wright both beat Daniel McTiernan as Coconuts won 2-1 and booked a second knock-out stage

against Muchachos, winners of their group. Coconuts eased through this 2-0 to guarantee their place in the top eight.

The quarter-final, semi-final final matches all followed a similar format. Wright lost the opening match against the opposing number one, Nick beat the number two and then Wright won the play-off match between the two losers. In the quarter-final it was St. Michael's A that provided the opposition. Wright led Chris

Lewis 2-1 but could not hold onto the lead before Nick and he both beat Reece Placid. The semi-final pitched the top two seeded teams together. BATTS had been untroubled until that stage and in Ryan Collins had the top ranked player in the tournament. He beat Wright 3-0 but Nick levelled the match was a last-gasp 15-13 fifth-game win over Tony West. Wright then inflicted a second defeat on West in what were BATTS' only defeats of the day as Collins remained undefeated.

And so to the final and another enthralling match as Wright again lost the opening match to the unbeaten Alain Choo-Choy as Godalming TTC took an early lead. Andreas Pusch, at that time also unbeaten throughout the day, had the chance to finish the match when he led Nick 2-1 and stood at deuce in the fourth. Nick. however, was now in top form and won that game 12-10 and the fifth 11-8. Wright then duly

completed the job with a 3-0 win over Pusch to claim the title for the Cardiff

BATTS were far too good as they beat Twins, Paul Martindill and Dave Langham, for third place.

Best performance by a local player came from Steve Buck who remained unbeaten throughout the day and was at his best when he inflicted the only defeat of the day on England number 87 Chris Lewis. Playing with Terry Boxall, they finished fourteenth. Ben Cunningham, a local league player at Cippenham, made his mark with a handful of wins including a 3-0 success over Paul Martindill, ranked 361 in England.

The tournament was organised and refereed by Graham Trimming and attracted a near maximum entry of 22 teams although only 20 played on the







### Women make successful debut

Table Tennis Club has entered a women's team in the Veterans' British League and success was immediate. In its debut weekend at Hereford the team won four of its five matches to sit in second place, level on points with the leaders, in Division 2.

However, the ladies did not get off to the start they really wanted. Their first match pitched them against Evesham. Despite an unbeaten performance from Cippenham number one Denise Weller, beating Sylvia Tyler and Margaret Dignum, they lost 4-2 to the team that would become overnight leaders. Sue Hayes, who lost narrowly to Dignum and 3-0 to Sue Felstead, then went on an unbeaten run of eight matches that carried her through the remainder of the weekend. In fact during those eight matches she won 24 games and lost only five.

Cippenham's two other matches on Saturday brought a 5-1 success over Halton and 4-2 over Billwood. These were Billwood's only dropped points of the weekend and when the dust settled it was they, rather than Cippenham, that led the table by virtue of a better sets aggregate. For that they had Shirley Dark, who went through the entire weekend unbeaten, to thank. When Cippenham played Billwood, Dark beat both Denise and Julie Dean but Sue and Julie both beat Susan Body 3-0 while Sue and Denise both beat Linda Attridge 3-2 in what might prove decisive results when the league concludes in May next year.

The Cippenham ladies kept up their winning ways on Sunday with another couple of 4-2 wins over Ashford 2 and Irish Colleens. Cippenham were 2-1 down at the half-way stage of the match against Ashford, local rivals from Staines, before the three players all won their second singles dropping only

one game in the process.

The men's team were playing a little higher in Division 1B of their competition. New veteran Steve Buck made his debut in the team and played well to win six of his ten matches. Saturday opened with a match against eventual league leaders Active 8 Plymouth. The 5-1 scoreline does not do justice to Cippenham as Paul Baker and Mike Rhodes both lost narrowly 3-2 to Mike Short while Mike also took Plymouth's top player Paul Whiting to a deciding game. Cippenham's one success came at the end of the match when Paul beat former Wales number one Dave Welsman.

Results then improved later on Saturday. Mike was the star, with wins over Kevin Mackey and Brian Finn, as Cippenham beat bottom team Irish Shamrocks 4-2 with Steve beating Anthony Redmond and Paul also beating Finn. Cippenham also drew 3-3 with second-placed Cardale Asset Management when the highlight was Steve's win over England number 24 veteran Chris Clinton. He also beat Tim Dyson while Paul scored a good win over Dave Harding.

On Sunday Cippenham secured their fourth point, a result that sees them placed sixth out of eight in the division, with a 3-3 draw against Fullmarks. For the second time Cippenham had Steve to thank for their point as he scored wins over Stuart Seaholme and Mark Wicker. Paul also beat Seaholme in the final set. Against Tameside, Steve got Cippenham off to a good start when he defeated Wayne Percival but that was as good as it got as the match, against a team that included 1980 European Men's Singles champion John Hilton, was lost 5-1.

It was the younger of the brothers, Joshua, who was first to show in the morning's under-13 event. Seeded three, he was helped by the absence of the number one seed and the failure of second seed Alex Kwaskowski who fell to fourth seed Tom Windram in the semi-final. However, such was Bennett's dominance of the event that it was not until the final that he dropped his first game. That went to Kent's Windram but Bennett fought back from 1-0 down to record ever better scores culminating in a straight-forward 11-3 in the fourth game.

Bennett had beaten Eda Emel Aydin in

the quarter-final of this mixed event and then Alex Sawa in the semi-final.

Big brother Jack Bennett was top seed for the Cadet (under-15) Singles in the afternoon and his dominance was even more complete, not dropping a single game en route to the title. After winning his group in a canter, his next opponent was familiar. Joshua Bennett had come through a tough 11-9 in the fifth match against Omar Khassal to reach the quarter-final but was shown no brotherly love as he was dispatched by Jack 3-0 in double guick time.
