## More Good Results in British

League

Lemon were the stars artin Adams and Rob as the Cippenham first team gathered another six points from four matches during the second weekend of the British League Division 1 South. Martin and RobL both won seven of their eight matches while Robert Hansell added another five. Mark Butler played only on the Saturday and won one of his four and played well considering the lack of practice he has been able to put in during the past few months.

The weekend did not start so well. Saturday morning brought the only lost points in a 5-3 defeat against a strong Harvey Barnets team that included three Hungarians and a Cypriot. Martin, against the Barnets number one David Csuti and RobL, against Laszlo Magyar, suffered their only defeats of the weekend in this match.

Saturday afternoon's fixture against Byng Hall resulted in a well deserved if a little flattering 7-1 win. Three of the Cippenham victories were gained by narrow margins in the deciding game. Mark beat Will Power to record his only win of the weekend while there was no stopping his team mates. Martin won 12-10 in the fifth against former Cippenham player Diccon Gray and then 11-8 in the fifth against Mark Romano. RobL won by the same scoreline against Ray Jordan but by then the points were well and truly in the bag.



Nick Hansell took Mark's place for the Sunday matches but an understrength Cippenham team rose to the occasion and recorded two 5-3 victories against Brighton and Horsham. Both Sussex sides felt the full force of Martin and RobL as they won all their matches on the day. RobertH also won one in each match to keep Cippenham in the hunt for the division title in third position and just one point behind the leaders.

After a pointless first weekend the Cippenham second team, playing at the same level as the first team in Division 1 South and Midlands, had a wonderful Saturday and recorded 5-3 wins over both EBS-Orange Westfield and ELGRE Nottingham II. It was a great all-round team performance with all four players contributing to the scoreline in both matches. Danny Baxter, making his British League debut for Cippenham, starred with a brace against Westfield while it was his High Wycombe based colleague Steve Buck that won his two against Nottingham. Lee Dredge and Mark Jackson scored one each in both matches.

After Krzysztof Zemelka cried off injured at the eleventh hour Graham Trimming was called up for the Sunday matches. The absence of either Danny or Krzysztof was a telling factor in the morning match against Bedford Modern. Steve played superbly to beat both Andy Trott and John Alsop but Cippenham's only other success came when Lee beat Trott 12-10 in the fifth end. In the

afternoon, division leaders DHS London Progress II were far too strong and won 7-1 with Steve securing the home side's only win.

The four points gained on Saturday give Cippenham a buffer equal to those four points ahead of bottom team Nottingham and a wonderful chance of escaping a relegation that loomed ominously.

Cippenham's third team had to travel to Chichester and returned with four points from the same number of matches. Ashley Shaw was the star with six wins from his eight matches, Chris Hansell won four while Phil Clarkson and Paul Elliott won three each. With eight points from the two weekends, Cippenham are nicely placed in the middle of the Division 3 South table but only three points off the lead. The highlight of the weekend was a 5-3 success over Ellenborough on Sunday afternoon. All the players scored in this match with Paul coming to the fore to win both of his.

# Vets Good Show in First Half

Veterans' British League

Roger Hookey made a sensational start to his career as a Cippenham player during the Veterans' British League first stage at Stoke on Trent during November.

Roger, a resident of the Isle of Wight and a team mate of Mike Rhodes in the Southampton League, was drafted into the Cippenham line-up because of the absence of Paul Baker through injury. Roger won eight of his ten matches, seven of them against players ranked above himself, as Cippenham performed above expectations and finished the first half of the season in third place in Division 2 with four points from a possible ten. Another new signing, Charlie Childs, who is also a team mate of Mike and Roger in the Southampton League, made his debut on Sunday and won one of his four matches. Charlie was unavailable for the Saturday matches so his place was taken by Cippenham stalwart Graham Trimming.

Mike also played a big part in Cippenham's success, winning six of his ten matches including remaining unbeaten on Sunday as the stronger Cippenham line-up gained three of their points.

Saturday was expected to be hard; in fact if the first two matches had gone with the rankings both would have been lost 6-0. The fact that a 3-3 draw was gained against BATTS Bulldogs and a 2-4 loss to Graham Spicer showed the Cippenham fighting spirit at its best. In these matches all four games against the opposing number one players were won including great wins for Mike and Roger over former England number two ranked star Stu-

Mike beat Eddie Herrity and Kerns, Roger beat Paul Martindill and Herrity and Charlie chipped in with a win against Martindill. Then, to complete an encouraging weekend, another expected 6-0 defeat was turned into a 3-3 draw as Mike beat both Phil Biggs and Wayne Percival to earn a point against the division leaders, the only point Tameside dropped all weekend. Roger beat Paul Collins as Cippenham surged
